

# 16th to 27th April 2007 Homestead Gallery

148A St. John's Street, London EC1V 4UD. Mon-Fri, 9am-6pm. Sat April 21st, 12-6pm. This exhibition follows on from the success of the event held in conjunction with the London Design Festival last year. The postcards feature typographically-led responses to randomly-assigned words created by participants from as far afield as Brazil, India, Russia and the US. The project is open to all – people who've got involved so far include Dave Gorman, Ed Fella and Isabelle Parker (age 10).
